Are inclusive communities built by celebrating commonalities or by celebrating differences?

How similar or different are we really?

What is more important for a community, similarities or differences?

What are the most effective ways for camps that want to create a culture of celebrating difference and similarities?

Mishna Sanhedrin Chapter 4
