TOPIC(S):	Leadership Development
LEARNING OBJECTIVE:	In this session participants will further their perception of what leadership can look and feel like by observing their own reactions to challenges, scenarios and situations
AUDIENCE:	5 th grade and up
TIMING:	90
APPENDICES:	N/A
MATERIALS NEEDED:	One small bouncy ball per participant, 20 pieces of scratch paper, blindfold.
SET-UP DETAILS:	Chairs in a circle and open space

Session Timeline & Outline:

Columbian Hypnosis (10 minutes)

Person A holds a hand up in front of the nose of Person B. Person A leads Person B, then Person B leads Person A.



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Quote Discussion (5 Minutes)

Quote on chart paper: "And Barak said unto her, If thou wilt go with me, then I will go: but if thou wilt not go with me, then I will not go. And she said, I will surely go with thee -Judges 4:8-14

- Discussion:
 - What does this quote say to you about leadership?
 - How does it compare to the exercise we just did?

Chaos to Order Ball toss (20 minutes)

In this activity there are very few rules to start and an overwhelming amount of balls! The only major rule is that you may not drop the balls as you are passing them around the circle. As a community, participants need to figure out how to create rules that work in order to succeed. In this game we will examine consensus as a leadership tool. Through communication we will build the ship while sailing it. Participants discuss what they know about these individuals and their leadership.

River Game (30 minutes)

Participants will stand on one side of a river and as a community must cross it without abandoning a single person. Challenges will include using limited resources that can be taken away at a moment's notice, diverse abilities, and limited verbal communication.

Discuss:

- What did you notice about your impulses?
- What were your strengths?
- What were your weaknesses?
- What would you do differently next time?
- What have you notice d through this exercise about leadership.

(10 Minutes) Closing Circle- <u>Chijii Cards</u>. Choose a card that you think represents your leadership style and explain any new insights.
