SUMMARY:	In this program, participants will attend a camp film festival including some of the best short films of the past and present- Submitted by Daniel Abramson and Tomer Moked
TOPIC(S):	Arts, Film
LEARNING OBJECTIVE:	Participants will learn how film can be a vehicle for starting conversations about important topics.
AUDIENCE:	This session can be modified to suit a variety of age groups by changing the film that will be shown. The time frame is ideal for older campers and staff, but a shorter program can suit the attention span of younger children.
TIMING:	75 minutes
APPENDICES:	None
MATERIALS NEEDED:	A/V set-up Popcorn Soft drinks
SET-UP DETAILS:	Room that can seat people comfortable for watching several short films.

### **SESSION TIMELINE & OUTLINE:**

5 minutes – Ticketing (choosing films)
40 minutes – First Screening
10 minutes – Intermission
30 minutes – Second Screening
5 minutes – Film fest after party (and reflections)

 Ahead of the session, set-up one or two screening rooms with A/V and seating for participants. For online videos, download content ahead of time onto a USB or external hard drive. Also, prepare some popcorn and soft drinks/bug juice for participants as they mingle in the "theatre lobby"

- Afterparty and reflections (5 minutes)
  - After the screenings, participants are invited to mingle and to discuss their favorite films and to share other great films that could be screened at camp.



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#### ADDITIONAL NOTES FOR BRINGING IT BACK TO CAMP:

There are a lot of ways that a film night can be modified to suit a lot of educational goals at camp. Choosing a film on a specific topic that is important to campers or staff can be a way to introduce meaningful discussion. Presenting multiple films with different voices and perspectives can help to create an atmosphere that welcomes a diversity of opinions at camp.

The format of the film festival can be a great way to begin conversations about difficult subjects in a way that is accessible to a variety of audiences.

This program might also be adapted to show films that have been made at camp. For example, kids can make and film puppet show re-telling of stories, or create mockumentaries or even music videos that can be screened at a camp film festival night.
