SESSION TIMELINE

- 00:00-00:15 Introductions, setting group norms
- 00:15-00:30 Discussion Rotation 1
- 00:30-00:45 Discussion Rotation 2
- 00:45-01:00 Discussion Rotation 3
- 01:00-01:15 Group Discussion

SESSION OUTLINE:

00:00-00:15 - Session leaders introduce the session topic and lead group in a round of introductions (name, pronouns, camp, some sort of mixer question). Session leaders will introduce <u>Jamboard</u> with already established group expectations and invite participants to elaborate, edit, etc. with their own personal sticky notes.

Session leaders will also introduce the three group topics--political/cultural, religious/spiritual, and gastronomical. Each group will discuss all three topics in break out rooms. Session leaders will lead topics with guiding questions (Appendix A)-the session leader doesn't need to ask all of these questions, rather just use them as a framework.

00:15-00:30 Group Discussion 1

(Session leaders will rotate to groups after 15 minutes. Groups will stay in the same space/room.)

00:30-00:45 Group Discussion 2

(Session leaders will rotate to groups after 15 minutes. Groups will stay in the same space/room.)

00:45-1:00 Group Discussion 3

(Session leaders will rotate to groups after 15 minutes. Groups will stay in the same space/room.)

1:00-1:15 All Group Discussion/Reflection

Reflection Questions-

- -What did they think this session was going to be about? How did the session surprise them?
- -What surprised them?
- -What was a highlight from this experience?

Split participants into breakout room to discuss their answers

Bring everyone back and invite a person from each breakout group to share out

BRINGING IT BACK TO CAMP & SHIFTING TO IN PERSON:

In order to best adapt this program for in camp use we would suggest:

- Finding a place that has 3 separate spaces/rooms for the group discussions
- Utilizing large Post Its for the beginning Brit discussion and wrap up Reflection
- Bringing everyone into a circle for the discussion where everyone can see everyone else
- Ensuring the discussion space is comfortable and accessible
