### Storybook Adventure Book

#### *Start Your Morning*

<b>AUTHOR(S):</b>	Asya Gribov
<b>SUMMARY:</b>	Incorporate a meaningful Jewish story into a hike or nature walk. <i>Submitted by Asya Gribov</i>
<b>TOPIC(S):</b>	Storytelling, Young Campers
<b>LEARNING OBJECTIVE:</b>	Participants will learn how to enhance a hike or nature walk with a meaningful story or book.
<b>AUDIENCE:</b>	Any size group, preferable for young campers
<b>TIMING:</b>	60 minutes
<b>APPENDICES:</b>	Handout -The Treasure
<b>MATERIALS NEEDED:</b>	Handout - The Treasure
<b>SET-UP DETAILS:</b>	Pages from a selected story (Handout) need to be hung along a walking path or hike.

#### **SESSION TIMELINE & OUTLINE:**

##### **'The Treasure' Story Walk**

- Photo copy a page of a book on separate pieces of paper (The Treasure, Handout). Hang each paper along a path in the woods or around camp prior to the start of the program.
- As participants walk along the hike, they are able to read the story. This can be done with various stories as an introduction to a program, or as the entirety of a hike.

##### **Reflection**

- What is the moral of the story?
- How does this story apply to camp?
- What other stories can be used in a story walk?

#### **ADDITIONAL NOTES FOR BRINGING IT BACK TO CAMP:**

- Adding a story to a hike can make the hike more exciting and engaging.
- You can also include a variety of activities at a few of the pages to incorporate an element of interactivity.
- Other stories can be used as well depending on your theme and goals.
