

Creating a Culture of Consent Camp Audit

General Audit Questions to Consider & Ask:

Do people know what to do and who to go to if they've been made to feel uncomfortable or taken advantage of in any way that breaches any boundaries of consent?

Do people know what to do and who to go to if the person in charge of supporting breaches of consent is the person who breached consent?

Are the terms and agreements of this area of camp clear and accessible at all times?

Further Questions to Explore

Where do questions of consent come into play in the tension between individualism and communalism?

What rituals exist to help us have communal experiences, since camp is often a communalist culture? How are we ensuring that these rituals model a culture of consent?

As we work to support campers making the transition from a year of isolation to a summer of communal engagement, how will we wrestle with the tension between individual and communal needs?
