Each age group curates their own “room,” station, or corner in the museum.

Part 1 – Introduction

- Visit the Nature Center.
- See the word "HOPE" lit up – it's just one word, but it can mean something different to each of us.
- We invite each group to build a part of the *Camp Gesher Museum of Hope* through creative art installations.
- Each group will:
 1. Reflect on a guiding content question.
 2. Create an interactive/artistic piece.
 3. Bring it to the Nature Center.

4. Leave 1–2 presenters at their station.
5. Rotate to explore the other exhibits.

Each group prepares their project based on their assigned theme and question.
